## Clean Sport

### Communication of Sanction

The athlete Ms Monica FRANCESCONI (ITA) has been sanctioned by the Italian Archery Federation (FITARCO), as follows: 2 months sanction, as of 25 March 2011. This decision has led to the disqualification of the results of the athlete in the competition where she was tested that took place in S. Martino in Trignano – Spoleto (ITA) on 27 February 2011.

## Judges & Coaches Committees

### Compound Team – Two Target Faces per Team

The fact that the new Compound Team round requires two target faces per team has led to some questions on how to shoot; and what if, etc.

First of all, the team members may decide how to shoot, left and/or right, but in an end of 6 arrows, there must be three arrows in each of the two faces. The principle is the same for the Mixed Team competition (though two arrows in each face).

If a team member misses the scoring zone or aims incorrectly and there is suddenly four arrows in one face and two arrows in the other face, as for example: Left 10-9-9-8 and Right 10-9; the rules say that only the three lowest arrows of that face (**the left one**) will have their value recorded, and the highest score becomes a miss. In this example the scores would be as follows: M-9-9-8-10-9 = 45 points.

If one plans to be "smart" and shoot three arrows in the right face and thereby seven arrows in total, one is only fooling himself. There will never be higher scores by making another mistake. Let's use the same example and add one more arrow: Left 10-9-9-8 and Right 10-9-9. Then the scores would be M-9-9-8-10-9-9, but of course only six arrows would be scored in an end. The lowest six values would count: 9-9-9-9-8-M = 44 points.

There cannot be any issue in a compound team shoot-off, as only using one target face for the three arrows is used—one arrow shot by each archer (as usual).

## Judges

### International Judge Candidates

After last year's success, the FITA/World Archery and AAF Judges Seminar 2011 was held at the Egypt Hotel, Bangkok from 3-5 June 2011. Very well organised by the Archery Association of Thailand in cooperation with the Asian Archery Federation this seminar was the largest ever held and accredited 11 new International Judge Candidates.

The seminar welcomed more than 80 participants, a combination of National Judges up for a continental test, Continental Judges up for the international test and a number of various sit-ins. Among the audience there were judges from Africa, Europe and Oceania.



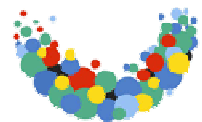

### Togo applies to FITA Membership

This country has submitted a membership application file conformed to our rule 1.4.2 According to this rule the current FITA Member Associations and Council Members have 60 days for raising in writing to the FITA Office any objection to this request of membership.

Without any serious objection within these 60 days (1 September 2011), a temporary FITA membership will be granted to the "Fédération Togolaise de Tir à l'Arc" (Archery Federation of Togo) until the 2013 FITA Congress. During this FITA Congress the final membership of this national archery association will be submitted to a vote.

### Olympic Solidarity Scholarship

In order for the athletes to prepare for the London 2012 Olympic Games, the Olympic Solidarity provides among a series of development programmes a scholarship for athletes covering financial needs (expenses for training and participation at Olympic qualifying tournaments, World Championships, etc.) of the athlete 24 months before the next Olympic Games.

Khatuna NARAMINIDZE (GEO) is among the thirteen lucky archers who have been granted a scholarship. The 37-year old Georgian female athlete graduated from a Sport Academy in Georgia. Before discovering her passion for archery, she practiced kayak peddling. She is a member of her local governmental administration (Khelvachauri district of Ajara Autonomy) for the development of sport. She is devoted to her family when she is not training or competing and she also trains young archers from Khelvachauri.

World Archery contacted her to have an insight on her Olympic preparation and the benefits of this scholarship. She says: "The scholarship is a great relief for my Olympic preparation and without it, it would be difficult. It has covered my health condition improvement, since I had surgery some time ago, and I was able to purchase archery equipment. I learned of this Olympic Solidarity programme through my National Olympic Committee when I was informed by my national federation that I was granted this scholarship. I feel privileged and more archers should benefit of this programme. My Olympic preparation is mainly focused on mental and physical training with my coach, AN Hyung Sang from Korea, known as Archie. It is also important for me to participate at tournaments and major competitions to improve my level and learn from my mistakes."

World Archery is still far from its goal in terms of number of scholarships for archery. However, the situation is progressing. World Archery reminds its Member Associations to apply for Olympic Solidarity programmes for the development of archery worldwide. ### Compound Seminar for Coaches

A seminar for compound will take place from 22-30 October 2011 at the FITA MEAC in Cairo, Egypt under the expertise of Josef PREISSER (RSA) and Coach MUN Baek Woon. The course is open to all FITA Member Associations in good standing with FITA, Coaches that are certified level I & II or with equivalent experience. No registration fee will apply!

- A letter of motivation as to why the participant is applying for this project
- Letter of support from your national federation, providing details on coaching status and conditions of the candidate

- A passport copy or at least all details
- Name of the departure airport
- Details of the arrival and departure flight: Airline Company, flight numbers, dates and times

For VISA applications, the participants must submit 4 to 5 weeks in advance their passport copies to FITA Development Department, in order to receive the invitation letter for the VISA procedure.

### Saudi Arabia and Egyptian National Teams

Coach MUN Baek Won of the FITA MEAC trained the Saudi Arabia and Egyptian national archery teams in view of the World Championships in Turin, Italy that will take place on 3-10 July 2011. The training camps were held during the entire month of June. For the Saudi Arabian team, Coach MUN conducted the training camp in Riyadh with a team of five recurve archers and one compound archer. The Egyptian team trained at the FITA MEAC Centre.

The focus was mainly on improving the skills and performances of both teams by focalising on mental and physical training. This will allow them to achieve better results in a short period of time. Coach MUN also applied pedagogical methods to change their shooting habits in order to increase their technical skills without destabilising them.

### Ghana

The World Archery News April 2011 issue informed that the Ghana Archery Association had applied to FITA Membership. Since none of the FITA Member Associations and Council Members has risen to the FITA Office any objection, the Ghana Archery Association has become a temporary member since 1 July 2011. The final membership of this association will be submitted to a vote at the next FITA Congress (1-2 July 2011).



### Lithuania

The Lithuanian Archery Federation has informed FITA/World Archery of the passing away of their President Mr Stanislavas SURUTKOVICIUS, aged 42 years old. He was not only a leader of the Lithuanian Archery Federation, a friend and colleague of their members, but a very good archer as well. He was a member of the national archery team, national records holder, and champion of the Baltic States.

He had planned to attend in World Archery Championships 2011 in Turin in July. He believed it to be an opportunity for Lithuania Archery to gain a chance to take part in the Olympic Games for the first time.

FITA/World Archery sends their sincere condolences to the Lithuanian Archery Federation, to Mr SURUTKOVICIUS's family and friends and to the whole Lithuanian archery community.

## Past Events

### World Cup Stage 2 Antalya

The second stage of the Archery World Cup 2011 season took place in Antalya, Turkey on 6-12 June 2011. The bronze and gold medal finals took place on Saturday afternoon on the beautiful beach of Antalya. The President of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) Jacques ROGGE attended the competition in the company of several members of the IOC. The champions from Porec Brady ELLISON (Recurve Men) and Rodger WILLETT Jr. (Compound Men) won a World Cup stage for the second time in a row, a rare feat. On the women's side, the Korean JUNG Dasomi and the Iranian Parsamehr MATHAB won their first individual gold medal in Recurve and Compound, respectively.

The team and mixed team bronze and gold medal finals took place on Sunday afternoon, again in attendance of the IOC President Jacques ROGGE, Vice Presidents Dr Thomas BACH and NG Ser Mian, as well as several other members of the IOC. The USA won the three gold medals at stake in the compound category. In recurve, the French men's team won its first gold medal. Korea was the best in the women's competition while China won the mixed team event.

After the first two stages, the American athlete Rodger WILLET Jr. took a commanding lead on the men's side of the Longines Prize for Precision. The current world champion Albina LOGINOVA (RUS) emerged in first place among the women. The Swiss watch-maker LONGINES launched the LONGINES Prize for Precision for archery in 2010. Each year, the most precise archers of two categories win the trophy, a watch and a 5,000 Swiss Francs prize. In 2011, the compound men and women athletes who shoot the most 10s during the individual qualifications and the matches as of the 1/16 eliminations of the World Cup will win the prize.

Thanks to very impressive performances during match play, which awarded him two individual victories in the first two World Cup stages, WILLET Jr. piled up 193 tens, about 40 more than his closer trailers, Jorge JIMENEZ (ESA), 155, Reo WILDE (USA), 153, and Martin DAMSBO (DEN), 150.

On the women side, the current world champion and World Cup Final winner LOGINOVA was the most consistent archer with a 5th place in Porec and a bronze medal in Antalya. She has now 126 tens and a small lead over the winner in Antalya, Parsamehr MAHTAB (IRI), who shot 119 tens. Laura LONGO (ITA) has 110 and Erika ANSCHUTZ (USA), 105.

## Awards

### Sports Manager of the Year

On the eve of the World Archery Championships 2011 in Turin, Mario SCARZELLA was awarded a prize by the Italian newspaper *Il Corriere Sportivo* as the "Sports Manager of the Year" for the Piedmont Sports Region.

Mario SCARZELLA, President of the Italian Archery Federation (FITARCO) and European Archery Union (EMAU), was totally unaware of this award. In his speech after receiving it, he attributed the prize to the more than 400 volunteers who will work for the World Championships 2011. He particularly thanked the President of the Organising Committee, Tiziana NASI, for her fantastic cooperation and support.



### Member of the British Empire (MBE)

Derrick LOVELL, an archer, judge, administrator and a dedicated servant of the sport for four decades, has been awarded an MBE in the annual UK honours list to celebrate the birthday of Queen Elizabeth II. He has been made a 'Member of the British Empire' for his services to archery. It means he and his family will go to Buckingham Palace to receive a medal from The Queen.

As an archer since the early 1970s, Derrick has embraced all disciplines during this time, but shot mostly as a Field archer. But such has been his dedication. He has become involved in all aspects of the sport over the years, including coaching, judging, committee work and international representation.

### Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM)

Gretel Ann DABOVICH, immediate past President and current Vice-President of Archery South Australia (Archery SA), has been awarded a 'Medal of the Order of Australia' (OAM) in the Queen's Birthday Honours List. She is Australia's first female recipient of an Australian Honour for service to the sport of archery.



Gretel Ann DABOVICH (née Besemeres) began in archery in 1955 aged 18, at Adelaide Archery Club and then Eden Field Archers in 1956. She has been actively shooting or in an administrative role ever since.

Her first official duty was as "Lady Captain" at the Archery Australia National Championships in 1958.

In the 1970s and 1980s she was a prominent shooter in South Australia and nationally, representing Australia at the New Zealand National Archery Championships in 1974.

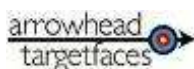

## **INTERPRETATIONS**

### **FITA CONSTITUTION AND RULES**

---

#### **Book 2, article 7.6.4.1 and Book 3, article 8.6.4.1**

*A Council Member has requested an interpretation on whether there should be any correction made by the organisers on the scorecard(s) after it is signed and submitted by the athlete. In some cases the total score is not correct and/or not the same on the scorecard and on the PDA.*

The Constitution and Rules Committee (“C&R”) finds the question presented to be within its terms of reference.

C&R has determined that the following interpretation is not contrary to the existing rules or Congress decisions.

#### **Response from the Constitution and Rules Committee:**

C&R unanimously agrees that Council’s intention was to make athletes responsible for the score card which they sign.

It is the athlete’s responsibility to calculate his scores correctly and organisers are not obligated to accept, verify or record scorecards which are incomplete or contain mathematical errors. An organizer should, in such instances, return the cards to the athletes if the error is identified at the time that the cards are being submitted by the athletes. An organizer, however, does not have an obligation, to review the scorecard when submitted or to identify errors on the scorecard. Acceptance by the organizers does not mean that the score as written is accepted.

If the score listed on the signed and submitted paper score card(s) (and in case of double scoring are the same on each card) is lower than the actual score, the athlete will be required to accept the (lower) score listed on the scorecard. If the PDA score is lower than the correct score on the scorecard, the athlete will be entitled to the higher score listed on the score card. If an athlete submits two scorecards with two different totals, the lower total will be used.
