Important Information on Uniforms

We have seen once more in the Youth World Championships that certain teams do not respect the clothing rules and in particular the name on the back of the shirt. In consultation with the chairman of the Judges Committee, we inform you that for all events listed below the clothing rules will be strictly implemented starting with the official practice. If an archer or official is not in conformity with the rules, his accreditation will be removed and only returned when the person complies with the rules. The events where these rules will be strictly enforced are:

- Indoor Archery World Championships, both Senior and Junior events (Rzeszow)
- Archery World Cup Stages (Santo Domingo, Antalya, Porec, Shanghai)
- Archery World Cup Final (Copenhagen)
- Archery World Championships (Ulsan)
- Youth World Championships (Ogden)
- World Games (Kaohsiung)
- Summer Universiade (Belgrade)
- Para-Archery World Championships (Nymburk)

This means that the archer or coach will not have access to the practice or competition field until the matter is resolved. For the archer this means that he will not be able to practice or compete and for the coach to coach the archer.

If the archer is not in order prior to the start of a match, he will lose the match by forfeit. It is also important to observe that if a team has several versions of a uniform the general look should be consistent. This means one archer cannot have a red shirt and the coach a white shirt for the same country as in the picture below:

The archer Mr. Augusto FREDDI (ITA) has been sanctioned by the Disciplinary Commission of the Italian Archery Federation as follows: 1 year ineligibility, as of 20 September 2008, 60 days of provisional suspension being deducted from this period.

This decision has led to the disqualification of the Athlete's results in the National 70m Olympic Round in Bozzolo, Italy, on 6 April 2008.

Constitution & Rules

Further Clarification from the Chairman of the FITA Technical Committee on the Official Interpretation from 12 June 2008 (string dampeners, Book 5, Articles 11.10.3.4.2 & 11.10.2.4.1)

As noted in the questions, suppressors can have different functions. In our sport, a suppressor could provide dampening/reduction in vibration, torsion, sound and in the case of the string attachments, possibly even amplitude.

1) *Exactly what kind of "suppressors" "dampeners", etc is FITA talking about in their interpretations (string mounted? Riser or limb mounted? Solid or flexible?*

All of the above. Suppressors could be string mounted, limb mounted or riser mounted. Riser and limb mounted suppressors/dampeners have the main function of reducing vibration and torsion. A bowstring mounted suppressor/dampener has similar characteristics and can also reduce sound and possibly string amplitude.

Many of the questions that come to our committee must be viewed on a case by case basis. This is also the reason the Technical Committee is not providing photos, because the market is flooded with numerous types of dampener/suppressor devices with new ones coming on the market all of the time. Providing photos of some devices but not others often causes significant issues where readers function in absolutes, while others understand the use of examples. Each person can have their own interpretation and the reason it is not possible to answer every question or cover every possibility in our written rules.

2) *Will FITA allow any other device on the riser or limb that contacts the string?*

The answer must be basically yes. If an object is attached to the riser and extends enough to contact the string, whether in constant contact or interval contact, it would first be considered a stabiliser due to length and attachment point and would also constitute a string guide, which is illegal under rule 7.3.1.6.1, bullet one and two.

If a dampening device were attached to the limbs and also contacted the bowstring, it would depend on the position, design and overall function. Here it would have to be determined if the device would constitute a stabiliser and if so, fall under rule 7.3.1.6.1.

3) *Will FITA accept any additional device on the riser, limb or string of the recurve or standard bow if it is not specifically included by the rules?*

The rules for bowstrings are very clear under each category and easily interpreted. For example, recurve bows (Olympic style) can have nothing on the bowstring other than what is listed under rule 7.3.1.2.1. Regarding the comment about "any additional device on the riser, limb of a recurve or standard bow", please remember that there are different rules for each discipline. Therefore, let's examine only the recurve (Olympic style) as the standard bow is more restrictive. On a recurve bow, stabilisers are allowed, as long as they do not touch anything but the bow and do not act as a string guide. No limit on the number of stabilisers currently exists.

Coaching

Olympic Solidarity Level 2 Coaching Course in India

The Archery Association of India is taking care of the education of his coaches in order to continue its progress among the world archery elite. On January 2006, a level 1 coaching course was conducted already under the umbrella of the Olympic Solidarity.

In October 2008, almost 50 coaches were trained at the level 2 during six intensive days conducted by the FITA Development and Education Director, Mr. Pascal COLMAIRE. This course was sponsored by the Olympic Solidarity.

EMAU Level 2 Coaching Seminar in Bulgaria

The EMAU level 2 coaching seminar was organised on 19-21 September 2008 in Sofia, Bulgaria for the same 33 participants from Serbia, Cyprus, Greece and Bulgaria, who had attended to the previous level 1 course. Twenty-two coaches participated in this level 2 seminar (seven from Serbia, four from Greece, eleven Bulgaria, but no coach from Cyprus). This seminar was again hosted by the Bulgarian Archery Association. The lecturer was Mr. Ivan YOTOV and the main seminar subject was equipment knowledge and tuning. Mr. YOTOV used multimedia for his lecturing presentation and also demonstrated in practice details of his lecturing, especially when teaching on bow tuning and adjustments.



On the last day of the seminar, all participants took written exams on the lecturing themes. They replied on ten questions set by the lecturer and they all passed successfully this exam. Before the end of the seminar, all participants received an EMAU Certificate stating that they "are Club Trainer in their country".

The 22 seminar participants are eligible for the EMAU level 3 (and final) coaching seminar, to be held in Sofia again, before the end of 2008. The EMAU project of conducting coaching seminars for the three levels will then be completed and the qualified participants will receive the final EMAU Certificate.

Olympic Solidarity Scholarship for a Greek Archery Coach

Konstantinos VOUROIS (Greece) was granted an Olympic Solidarity scholarship to attend a level 2 coaching course at the FITA Middle East Archery Centre in Cairo, Egypt, on 2-8 November 2008. His training with the MEAC Coach, Mr. MUN Baek-Woon, will be extending for a pair of weeks.

We ask all Member Associations concerned to inform us by 31 December 2008 if it is their intention to accept these places. It is mandatory for all Member Associations to confirm the places by this date.

A final confirmation will be asked by 1 May 2009 as well as an initial name for the athletes who will take the place.

Changes will be possible in name after this date but since we do not know the exact details of the accreditation system we will only be able to give you full details when the accreditation system will be available. However, after 1 May 2009, if a country refuses a place a penalty will apply.

We also ask all Member Associations that have quota places to inform us by 31 December 2008 if they plan to bring officials and the number of officials they plan to bring. Officials are at the cost of the countries concerned and there is no guarantee that there is enough accreditations and accommodation available for all officials. Places will be allocated on a first come, first serve basis if we cannot find additional places.

For countries that have not obtained quota places, they can ask an invitation place for a specific athlete as is the case for the Olympics. These requests should arrive at FITA before 31 December 2008 explaining which category they ask an invitation place for, the athlete's name and detailed information on his/her results. Invitation places can only be asked by countries that do not have yet a quota place in the category concerned (e.g. if country X has a place for compound women, country X can still ask for a place for compound men, but cannot ask for a second place in compound women).

The FITA Field Committee will propose a list of possible quota places based on these applications and the FITA Executive Committee will allocate these places in cooperation with the IWGA.
