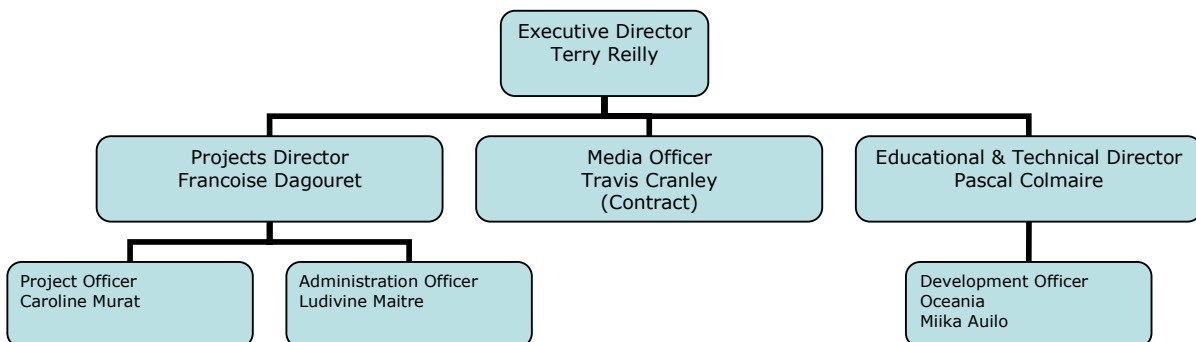
### **FITA Directory**

## **FITA Congress**

### **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

The President, Mr. Jim Easton, presented a comprehensive report on the activities of FITA over the last 2 years and emphasized the need to us to do everything possible to keep archery in the Olympic Games. All sports are under pressure to justify their position in the Olympics and archery must raise its profile in all areas.

All written reports will be distributed with the Congress Minutes.

### **MOTIONS / BYLAWS**

A total of 49 motions on rule changes were put to Congress along with the ByLaws previously published. The rule changes will be incorporated into the new Rule Book and the laws will become effective on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2004. Only one motion was to have immediate effect and that related to the creation of the 3D World Championships.

The C&R Committee will meet soon in Lausanne to review the FITA Rules and incorporate the changes.

### **GOLD PLAQUETTE**

At the FITA Congress in New York, Dr. Karol Hibner, Chairman of FITA Medical Committee was presented the Gold Plaquette for his outstanding contribution in establishing the FITA anti-doping policy and for his contribution to the WADA anti-doping code. Dr. Hibner has been in hospital with a serious illness and we all wish him a speedy recovery.

Elections for a number of positions on Council and several Committees were held. We welcome some new people to Council and Committees and sincerely thank those retiring members for their contribution to the sport.

### **Major Events**

### NEW YORK

**What a great success!** The 42<sup>nd</sup> World Outdoor Target Archery Championships was held in New York City from July 14 to 20 with the finals taking place at Central Park, a superb site for such a competition.

The four individual titles were won by archers from the host nation the United States, Australia, South Korea and Italy. It is the first time the four titles are won by four different nations since archery switched to its current World Championships format in 1993.

In the team competitions, South Korea continued its record run of success and the United States re-established itself as a major force. Indeed, the South Koreans won both the men's and women's team recurve events, while the US archers matched the feat by winning both the men's and women's compound events.

The team finals were held on the last day of competition at a World Championships which attracted a record of more than 500 archers from 70 countries to New York. The next World Outdoor Target Archery Championships will be held in Madrid, Spain, in 2005.

**ATHENS TEST EVENT**

***How windy can it get!!!*** Very strong winds played havoc with the scores and performances of the Women on the first day of the Eliminations. Fortunately, the winds dropped significantly over the next few days.

The elements of Warm Up field, Transport from Warm Up to Stadium (Panathinaiko) and shooting in the old Stadium were tested under varying conditions but most days it was HOT HOT HOT! The Scoring and Results system was also tested and a number of "bugs" were discovered and changes made to the operation of the scoreboards so that they were more "spectator friendly".

### ***Anti-Doping News***

#### **WORLD ANTI-DOPING CODE**

At the New York Congress in July FITA has formally adopted the new World Anti-Doping Code, which aims, under the auspices of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), to bring more harmonization in the anti-doping rules among sports organizations and governments all over the world. In the next months FITA, in particular through its Medical and C&R Committees, will work in order to include the new Code and its standards (including the new 2004 list of prohibited substances and methods, which will be published by WADA in October 2003) in its own rules. The new anti-doping rules should be effective by January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2004 and should be also enforced by the Member Associations.

#### **THERAPEUTIC USE EXEMPTIONS (TUE)**

We remind all athletes and Member Associations that they shall submit to FITA their applications for TUE permitting the use of a prohibited substance or method no less than 21 days before participating in an event. This time limit should remain the same from 2004 onwards in the new WADA standard for TUE.

### ***FITA Development***

The development of archery in all countries continues to be a major focus of FITA. As well as developing new countries and regions, we need to strengthen our existing organizations so that they can increase and widen their activities.

What has been the increase in the number of clubs in your Member Association over the last 4 years? Has membership increased? What is your plan for Schools? Do you get local TV coverage for events?

You will soon receive a survey from the FITA Office asking these and many more questions. The statistics gathered will assist us in better planning and help shape out future goals.

### Online FITA Calendar

#### REMINDER

As you know, FITA now provides a calendar for all Member Associations to enter their FITA Events which qualify for FITA Stars and World Records. The system is designed for all FITA recognized tournaments and replaces the paper or email submission for the registration of tournaments. The system is mandatory for tournament registration for Member Associations with more than 10 tournaments a year and optional for all others. Some of the National Federations have already started using the system and Member Associations wishing to participate can upload their calendar by using the spreadsheet that is linked from the FITA website.

The system will only show the registered tournaments for which the National Federations have to pay the registration fee. An invoice will be send to the Member Associations as in the past at the end of the year, but the payment is now made after the tournaments.

Our rules state that an event must be registered at least 30 days before the start of the event. If the event is not on this calendar, a claim will not be recognized.

#### Advantages for National Federations

- They can upload their calendar themselves and it will become live immediately (no confirmation from FITA is necessary).
- They make changes themselves.
- They renew their calendar easily by allowing duplication of old events with new dates to accommodate for yearly tournaments.
- This is a planning tool for national teams.

#### Advantages for archers

- An up-to-date calendar of all FITA events worldwide
- An assurance that the events they will participate in are recognised by FITA for World Records and performance awards.

#### Advantages for FITA

- Easier process for record verification.
- Easier accounting of the tournaments.
