FITA Rule Book Edition 2002

The new edition of the FITA Rule Book will go to the printer early March and we will be distributing the new version in the middle of March. It will come into effect on the 1st April 2002.

As in the past we will produce the following versions

Printed versions :

- Full Book version which includes Books 1-5 and which will be from now on in a ring binder enabling the insertion of new by-laws. Cost 12 US\$ (English and French)
- Single Book version : which will be supplied in a bound version which will be 5 US\$ for Book 1 and 3 US\$ for Books 2-5 (Only in English)

Electronic versions:

Cd-Rom : 7US\$ (English and French), two editions will be sent. One in English only and one in English and French when the translation is finished.

Internet version in pdf (English and French)

Each Member Association, Continental Association, Associate Member and FITA official will be sent as soon as available :

One Full Book version in English.

One CD-Rom version in both languages

One set of single book versions in English or One full book in French for French speaking countries.

Each FITA International Judge will receive a full book version in English and a CD-Rom (For French speaking judges a French copy will be sent as well)

World Records

Introduction of World Records for Masters

On the 1st April FITA will recognise Masters World Records. Every archer competing that is born on the 31/12/1952 or earlier will be able to claim in 2002 Master World Records. As this change will generate a lot of workload for all parties involved C&R in co-operation with the FITA office has worked out a simplified procedure. In total 84 new records will be registered and we expect many changes especially in the starting phase.

Procedure for Masters records from 1st April – 30th September .:

- **Each Member Association is requested to keep track of the highest scores shot by masters of their association in the period from the 1st April till the 30th September 2002.**
- **On the 30th September the member associations will send to FITA the list of highest scores for each type of record including scorecard, result list and all other information requested by Article 5.5**
- **FITA will produce by the 10th October the first list of world records based on the highest score sent in by a Member Association and these records will be the starting point for future world record changes.**
- **From the 1st October the regular procedure for world records will be in place and Member Associations are requested to send in the records within 10 days of the tournament being held.**

Introduction of Indoor Records for Cadets

On the 1st April FITA will recognise World Records for Cadets in the Indoor discipline. Every archer competing that is born on the 1/1/1986 or later will be able to claim in 2002 Cadet World Records. As this change will generate a lot of workload for all parties involved C&R in co-operation with the FITA office has worked out a simplified procedure. In total 28 new records will be registered and we expect many changes especially in the starting phase.

Procedure for Cadets records from 1st April – 30th September .:

- **Each Member Association is requested to keep track of the highest scores shot by cadets of their association in the period from the 1st April till the 30th September 2002 in Indoor competitions.**

- **On the 30th September the member associations will send to FITA the list of highest scores for each type of record including scorecard, result list and all other information requested by Article 5.5**
- **FITA will produce by the 10th October the first list of world records based on the highest score sent in by a Member Association and these records will be the starting point for future world record changes.**
- **From the 1st October the regular procedure for world records will be in place and Member Associations are requested to send in the records within 10 days of the tournament being held.**

Interpretation

Archery Australia requests an official interpretation (clarification) of the following issue:

The memo circulated by the FITA Field Archery Committee "What is allowed or not allowed on unmarked FITA Field Rounds" raises the question regarding the statement "more than one sight scale on your sight bar, your bow or your notes." Many bow sights have a calibrated scale provided by the manufacturer (which may be either on the face of the sight bar, or on the side) and, if this is the case:

Does this mean on the side of the sight bar, the archer cannot have his/her own markings for personal use - without any reference or memorandum to the manufacturers scale?

The issue became evident, when judges at our Junior National Championships have been asking archers to remove either their own sight scales or to tape up the manufacturer's for the Unmarked Field Round - because of the wording in the above publication. The Jury of Appeal dismissed the protest of a team manager based on the fact that two FITA publications (the one mentioned above and "FITA Field Archery Judging") clearly state that no more than one sight scale is permissible. The Australian Open Championships are taking place in early April, therefore I would appreciate clarification of this matter before then.

QUESTION SUBMITTED BY ARCHERY AUSTRALIA - February 4, 2002

In carefully reviewing the request for interpretation submitted by Archery Australia, it is the majority opinion of the FITA Technical Committee to make the following statement.

It is our strong belief that any publication written by a FITA committee or member cannot circumvent or contravene the FITA Constitution. Additionally, Judges must not use supplementary information that was published by a committee as a guideline for enforcing rules that are not found in the FITA C&R book. The rules of shooting are clearly presented in the FITA Constitution and Rules and those are the rules that must be adhered to and not guidelines that should not and do not have any official capacity. We feel it is highly unfair for any competitor to have equipment legal at one event and then to have it disallowed at another event because a judge has based their decision on an unofficial guideline or interpretation. Concerning the comment about sight "scales" in the inquiry, there is no reference in the C&R book to sight scales. In article 9.3.4.2 there is a reference to scales, but this is for Field Glasses or other visual aids. The only references besides 9.3.4.3, and 9.3.1.5 last bullet point which pertains to this issue is 9.3.4.5 where no memoranda is allowed apart from notes concerning the competitors normal sight marks. Therefore, if we follow articles 9.3.1.5, which allows a reference for sight marks to be attached to the bow, 9.3.4.3 which disallows range finders and 9.3.4.5 where no memoranda is allowed apart from notes concerning the competitors normal sight marks, then the following conclusion must be formed. That is, if a competitor has sight marks written on their sight bar and has another set of marks written on their sight that are not part of the manufacturers generic sight scale, then this would constitute a violation. However, if there is a generic scale on the sight bar from the manufacturer that has obviously not been modified and a set of sight marks from the archer, then this should be allowed. Our opinion is that a generic sight scale provided by the sight manufacturer does not constitute a range finding graph or "scale". In this regard the archer would be allowed to have one written set of sight marks on the sight and the manufacturers scale as well, as long as the manufacturers graph or scale is not modified. However, if the manufacturers scale were used in conjunction with sight memoranda on the bow or elsewhere with the archer, then any written sight marks on the sight bar would not be legal. It would also be illegal for the manufacturers scale to have additional writing on it (beyond what was printed by the sight manufacturer) and have another written set of sight marks on the sight bar. If there is a need for additional clarification or if more information is required, please contact me at your earliest convenience. Note: Rule 9.3.4.4 was discussed, but it was felt by the majority of this committee that it falls into the same category as 9.3.4.3 and does not actually pertain to the question raised by Archery Australia. Clarification

There has been some misunderstanding on the FITA Interpretation on the multiple optical fiber pins and especially the reference to a specific site tunnel from a certain manufacturer. Since we want to avoid any misunderstanding on the matter we hereby publish the new rule as it will be published in the new edition of the rule book edition 2002:

7.3.1.5 A bowsight for aiming is permitted, but at no time may more than one such device be used.

7.3.1.5.1 It shall not incorporate a prism or lens or any other magnifying device, leveling or electric or electronic devices nor shall it **provide for more than one sighting point**.

7.3.1.5.2 The overall length of sight (tunnel, tube, sighting pin or other corresponding extended component) shall not exceed 2cm.

- **The sight point may be a fiber optical sight pin. The total length of the fiber optical pin may exceed 2cm, provided that the attachment or ending is not in the competitors line of vision at full draw. It can only provide one illuminated aiming spot at full draw.**

Therefore a sight tunnel with multiple Fibre Pins (as for example the Beiter Sight Tunnel with inserts No.18 and No. 19 which was displayed in the FITA information 12/2001)", is not legal under the current rules for the recurve division. However, The Beiter Sight Tunnel without these inserts is perfectly legal.

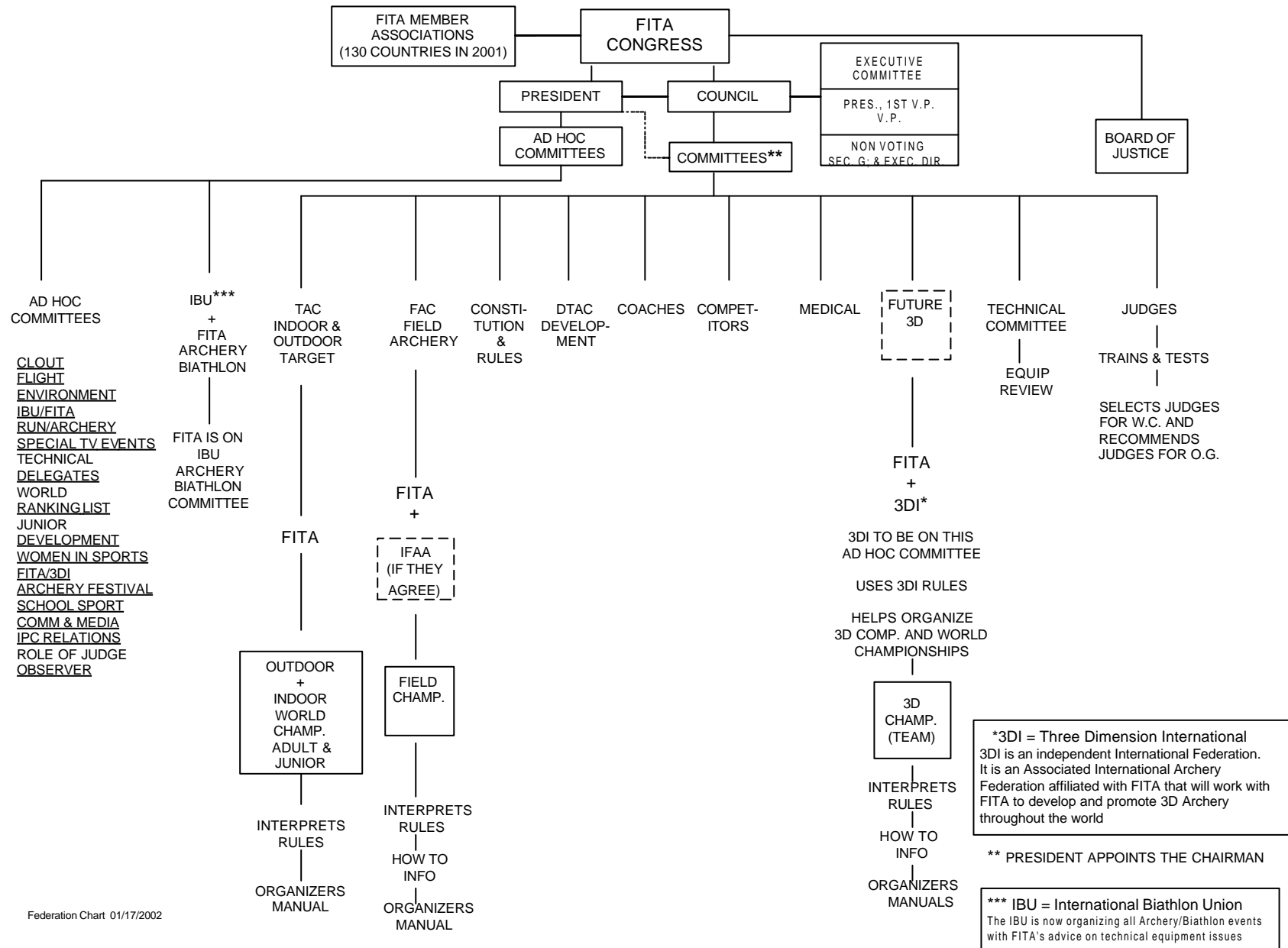

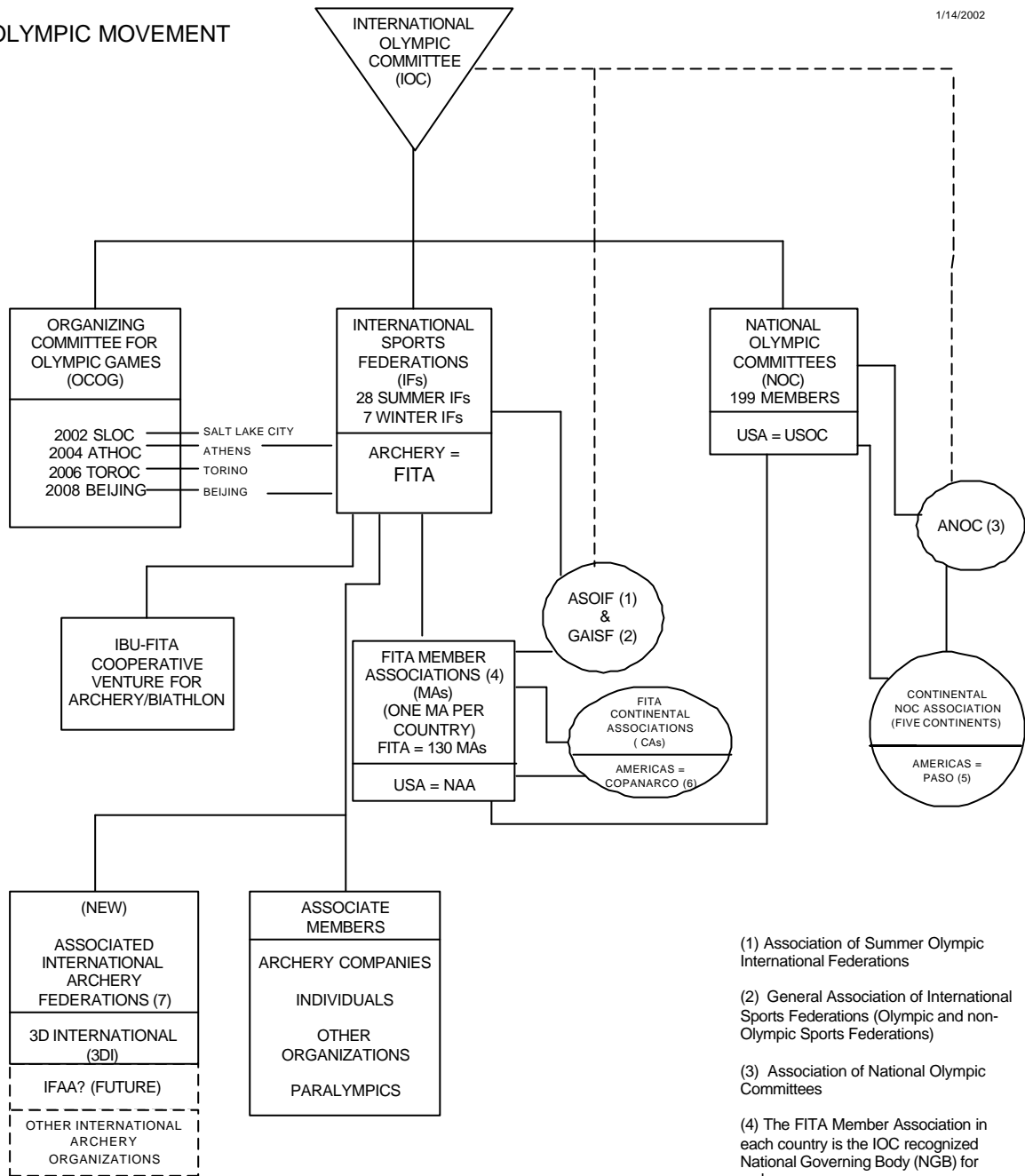

Dear President

Further to receiving the decision of the Swedish Archery Federation to suspend its archer for a period of 70 days, the FITA Executive Committee has consulted with the FITA Medical Committee chairman to review this decision and to decide on further action.

The chairman of the FITA Medical committee has informed the FITA executive Committee that the archer concerned needed the medication found in his body for a chronic disease. The fact that the substance was found, is also not disputed by the archer concerned.

However the fact remains that the archer failed to submit a request for dispensation as required by article 1.10 of Appendix 4 of the doping control procedures to the FITA Medical Committee and therefore is guilty of doping. However it is clear that there was no intent to conceal the taking of the medication since the archer even showed his doctors subscription at the equipment control and mentioned it on the declaration form during the sampling.

Therefore it is proven to both the FITA Medical Committee and the FITA Executive Committee that there was no intent to commit a doping offence but that the positive sample was solely due to the lack of knowledge of the existing rules by the archer and his team-management. This however points out the responsibility of the National Federation and the Team management who have not fulfilled their role in making sure that their national team members know the FITA rules.

This is to the FITA Executive Committee an even more serious issue than the actual doping offence since the positive sample has damaged the reputation that archery is a doping-free sport as a result of a lack of distribution of information by the national federation.

After careful reflection the FITA Executive Committee has decided that it will not send this case to the FITA Board of justice but that a strong warning is send to the Swedish Archery Federation informing them that if such a case would happen again, the case will be forwarded to the FITA Board of Justice requesting for a severe sanction.

We have copied this letter to all FITA member associations since we consider that this warning should also serve as example to the other member associations and that rule 1.10 is applicable for ALL FITA WORLD and CONTINENTAL CHAMPIONSHIPS and that under no circumstances a simple medical subscription or a national dispensation is sufficient.



We have also written to WADA to make the standardisation of medical dispensation a clause of the new anti-doping code that is currently under development.

We hope that we can count on your support to continue the battle against doping in archery and the sport in general. Archery is a sport luckily not faced with a lot of doping offences but cases like this one can cause a change of the reputation of a clean sport with a lot of possible negative consequences.
