#### World Youth Championships 2019

World Archery's executive board awarded Madrid in Spain the right to host the 2019 World Archery Youth Championships during its meeting on 16-17 July ahead of the fourth stage of the 2018 Hyundai Archery World Cup. Madrid beat a bid from Taipei City to the appointment. The board also approved a number of bylaws.

#### Olympic Solidarity Scholarship

Bangladesh's Md Ruman Shana, a resident athlete at the World Archery Excellence Centre in Lausanne, won the recurve men's event at the 2018 Challenge de Lausanne tournament on 1 July. He is one of three athletes currently on a programme supported by Olympic Solidarity to live and train at the Centre as he attempts to qualify for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games. The others are Areneo David, who became Malawi's first Olympian archer at Rio 2016, and Mahmoud Elkhailifa of Sudan.

## World Records

### Mixed Team

The mixed teams from Korea and the Netherlands set archery's first official ranking round world records for the pairs event at the fourth stage of the 2018 Hyundai Archery World Cup in Berlin, Germany. The records were officially added to the rulebook by World Archery's executive board before the tournament; previous scores were not claimable. Additional records were set in the junior categories, for mixed teams in which both athletes were under the age of 21.

## Events

### Indoor World Series

World Archery has announced the six events confirmed on the 2018 Indoor Archery World Series calendar, a refreshed international tour running from November to February, featuring events in Luxembourg, Macau, Rome, Seoul, Nimes and Las Vegas. The tournaments are open entry, meaning archers register themselves rather than participation only being as part of a national team. Cairo has been added to the 2019 calendar.

### Berlin 2018

Turkish archer Mete Gazoz beat Lee Woo Seok of Korea with an incredible shoot-off arrow in the recurve men's gold medal match at the fourth stage of the 2018 Hyundai Archery World Cup in Berlin, Germany. The last time the pair faced each other was at the Nanjing 2014 Youth Olympic Games, where Lee beat Gazoz in straight sets. In Berlin the contest was much less one-sided.



Lee Eun Gyeong beat home favourite Lisa Unruh to the recurve women's individual gold medal, qualifying herself for the season-ending final in the process – but eliminating teammate Kang Chae Young. Lee's teammate Jung Dasomi also won bronze over Tan Ya-Ting of Chinese Taipei.



Chinese Taipei beat Korea in an amazing shoot-off to take the recurve men's team gold medal. Wei Chung-Heng delivered an arrow in the X-ring when he needed not only a 10, but a better 10 than Im Dong Hyun's last shot to claim victory for Chinese Taipei. While the Korean men were relegated to silver, the women team did leave Berlin with gold, taking a straight-set victory over Great Britain.



Frenchwoman Sophie Dodemont ticked off three major achievements in Berlin. She won two gold medals – compound women's individual and team – and qualified for circuit's season-ending final in Samsun, Turkey. It's her first World Cup individual title at age 44.

It had been years since the French women had brought back a team medal. They beat India by one point to win the compound women's team title in Germany, handing India a second silver in the event on the season.



Croatia beat the world number one ranked USA compound men's team to gold to win the nation's first ever World Cup team victory. Domagoj Buden won a second medal for the stage with individual silver, defeated by Mike Schloesser, as it was the Dutchman's second stage win of the season after Antalya.

### Asia Cup Stage 3

Chinese Taipei's recurve women's team and individual compound woman Wu Ting-Ting prevented Korea sweeping the gold medals at stage three of the 2018 Asia Cup in Taipei City, Chinese Taipei. The tournament was due to finish on Thursday 12 July but had to be cut short. The entire schedule was completed in just two days, on 9-10 July, to avoid incoming typhoon Maria.

Jason Hurnall beat Finn Matheson of New Zealand, 6-2, in the final of World Archery Oceania's continental qualification tournament for the Buenos Aires 2018 Youth Olympic Games to complete Australia's maximum quota of two. Australia won a girls' quota place at the World Archery Youth Championships at the end of 2017.

**African Youth Games**

Archers from Egypt, South Africa and Namibia won quota places to the upcoming Youth Olympic Games in Argentina by making the final of the archery events at the 2018 African Youth Games in Algiers, Algeria. Egyptian athletes Israa Yassen and Bahaeldin Aly made the finals in the girl's and boy's events. Their opponents Wian Roux, of South Africa, and Namibia's top seed Quinn Reddig also qualified places for their nations with gold medal match berths.

**Tokyo 2020**

The mascots of the Olympic and Paralympic Games Tokyo 2020 greeted the Japanese public for the first time at their naming ceremony on 22 July. The Tokyo 2020 Olympic mascot's name was revealed as Miraitowa, based on the Japanese words mirai (future) and towa (eternity) combined. The Tokyo 2020 Paralympic mascot's name was revealed as Someity, (pronounced soh-may-tee) which comes from someiyoshino, a popular cherry blossom variety, and additionally echoes the English phrase "so mighty".

**Costa Rica**

The National Archery Federation of Sri Lanka has appointed Michael Peart, 41, as foreign coach. The former British archer already conducted the Youth Olympic Games training programme. Among his past experiences were also Paralympic Coach for Archery GB and archery consultant for London 2012 Olympic/Paralympic news service.



**Course in Oceania**

Participants from Fiji, New Caledonia (FRA), New Zealand, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga attended a level two coaching course held in the *Centre International Sport et Expertise (CISE)* Noumea, New Caledonia on 16-24 July, conducted by Pascal Colmaire, World Archery Director of Education and Development, and supported by the Olympic Solidarity, the French Olympic and Sports Committee, the French Archery Federation and the Archery League of New Caledonia.



The project is to train World Archery certified Coach Trainers from Oceania in a near future, so that the continent has a pool of continental experts able to conduct coaching course in the region at a reduced cost for travel and with a good cultural understanding of the coach candidates. On the course programme in Noumea were suggestions for an efficient an efficient National Coaching System (NCS); evaluation of the shooting form of an archer; training process of intermediate shooting techniques, appropriate physical developments, psychological skills, coaching skills in tournament and during practice, competitor' skills and training to equipment tuning.

**Donation to Palau**

Palau Archery President Brandon Giramur, Vice President Edward Kenic and Sports Development Officer Tutii Chilton will strive to introduce archery to other region islands during the 2018 Micronesian Games on 15-27 July 2018 in Yap, where it is on the program as s demonstration sport. To support the project World Archery has offered to Palau a level-one kit of archery equipment including twelve fitted bows and various other items. The island nations and islands participating in the Games are Commonwealth of Northern Marianas, Territory of Guam, Federated States of Micronesia (Yap, Chuuk, Pohnpei and Kosrae states), Republic of Marshall Islands, Republic of Nauru, Republic of Palau, and Republic of Kiribati.

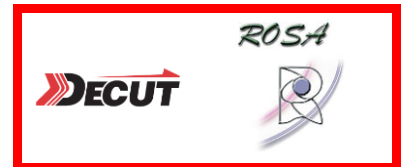
